

## **Laminate Tables – General Care & Cleaning**

## **Laminate Table Tops:**

**Cleaning:** Using a mild household spray wipe down the benchtop with a soft cloth. Dry using a soft cloth so as not to leave any cleaning solutions on the surface.

You may also use Methylated Spirit on a soft cloth, using a circular cleaning motion. Thoroughly clean over the wider area with water and detergent on a damp cloth afterwards to remove any residual Methylated Spirit.

Always ensure that you refer to the recommendations provided by the cleaning product manufacturer before use.

**Care:** Do not use any of the following on laminate tops or timber table legs: Commercial Cleaning Products, Abrasive Cleaners, Scouring Pads or Abrasive Papers, Solvents, Thinners, Turpentine (Turps), Ammonia, Bleach, Acetone, Easy-Off BAM!, M.E.K. or any other cleaning agents containing organic solvents or the above mentioned products.

Do not place hot pans, pots or similar hot objects directly on the surface of the product. Do not place essential oils, burners or diffusers onto the laminate surface as these may damage the surface.

Do not place heavy objects on the product; apply substantial weight to the product including standing, sitting or lying or; apply excessive impact to or mishandle the product, including scraping objects along, cutting items on the laminate surface, throwing objects against or dropping objects on the product's surface.

## Timber table legs and frame:

**Cleaning:** To clean, wipe with a damp cloth before buffing with a dry cloth. In the event of more stubborn marks, a solution of mild detergent should be used on the cloth. Silicone based polishes should not be used on the wood as they will build up and leave a sticky residue on the surface.

**Care:** Unless otherwise specified, our timber furniture is usually finished in a durable clear matt lacquer or in some cases a painted finish. This provides an easy to care for durable finish that doesn't compromise the natural beauty of the wood grain.

Solid woods may expand and shrink with differences in temperature and humidity. Take care not to place your furniture next to heaters vents or anywhere subject to excessive changes in temperature or moisture content. UV light can discolour furniture and break down finishes, avoid placing furniture in direct sunlight. We recommend that all kitchenware and beverages should be placed on mats and any spillages should be wiped away immediately. Organic solvents, such as fingernail polish and remover, perfumes, essential oils, and alcoholic drinks may affect the lacquer finish, wherever possible avoid contact with lacquered or painted timber surfaces.
